It is by now sufficiently clear that so long as the Government insists on Mgr Makarios "denouncing vio. lence", so long, mevitably, will the Archbishop refuse to open his mouth.

Meanwhile the campaign against EOKA in all its manifestations, the arrests cur-fews and unending detention of people charged with no crime will continue to embit ter relations and deepen the gulf between the communities whose duty it must be to come together and cooperate with goodwill in the future. Because the Times of Cyprus, the only English owned newspaper in the Island, be-lieves that this deadlock must and can be broken in the interests of the good name of Britain and Cyprus alike we took last week a step which might change the situation overnight.

Three questions

We asked the Cyprus Gov-ernment for authority to cable three simple questions to the Archbishop in the Seychelles. They were:-

- Do you approve the Unit-ed Nations resolution on


